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A word from the Headteacher...

Outstanding!

A big well done to our residential Drake's team for their Ofsted **Outstanding** inspection. The full report can be found on the ofsted website and soon on our own new updated website. I am sure that you all agree the residential team do an amazing job supporting families.

There have recently been a couple of incidents with a pupil bringing in firecrackers and passing them around to other Key Stage 4 pupils. As a school we have taken this extremely seriously and with the support of parents and carers given a clear message that this will not be tolerated. We will work with students to support them when things go wrong and many times we could be seen as too understanding. There is however a boundary that cannot be crossed for the safety of all of us. As students get older and into KS4 they have to understand that this sort of behaviour will not be accepted at college or a workplace, we would not be doing our job if we did not give that message.

On more of a positive we have had CSW working with our Year 10 pupils from across all sites as we have funding to put in place a personalised work experience programme. The interviews with the students happened this week therefore you will hear more soon.

As you can see from the photographs there is some great learning going on and this week you can see Science, Seymour, Wolseley, Farm, Prospect and our mainstream support centre Darwin.

The Year 11 Entry Level science students have been making compounds of magnesium and iron this week.








Year 11 Biology- Sensitivity Investigations

Science- Reaction Time Competition



PSHE and Science was joined to learn about personal hygiene and the importance of washing hands. We set up an experiment with bread to be monitored over the next few days, after which the students rubbed invisible gel over their hands before being sent to wash them. The gel glows green under UV light, showing up any traces that have been missed in the washing off process. Some of those who thought they had cleaned their hands were quite surprised to see parts of their hands and nails light up under the lamp! Watch this space for the results of the bread experiment...
