

The Code of Practice places a duty on local authorities to describe the provision for SEND that families can expect to find in schools.

The **Plymouth Graduated Approach to inclusion document** is currently in the process of being drafted and we would welcome your feedback.

The document has a number of important functions, which include:

- 1. Clarifying for families that they can expect schools to provide, for example, at SEN support
- 2. Providing a reference point for ensuring that a request for an EHC plan needs assessment is appropriate.


