Transforming Futures Trust

We did it! We hope you all received the email from Matthew Barnes, CEO of Transforming Futures Trust, our new Academy. Staff were delighted to hear that the conversion finally took place on 1st March 2023 and we are now part of Transforming Futures Trust.



As part of the conversion agreement, we were thrilled to hear

confirmation of a £4.4million **rebuild** of the Row Lane Secondary building! This will mean a new PURPOSE BUILT provision for our students - nothing short of what they need or deserve, to enable them to enjoy their education time with us!

There will be lots of meetings and consultations prior to planning permission being submitted. Our wider community of families will be part of this process so do watch this space.

During this time we have had to make the decision to close our off site Wolseley Centre provision - the DT lessons will now take place on site at Row Lane. We have just appointed Mr David Perriam as our new teacher of DT - who is very excited about having a purpose built DT Room within the new Secondary build!

An additional INSET day has been agreed for us to undertake induction and health and safety training with the Trust. This date will be immediately after the Easter break - on Monday 17th April. The school will be closed to pupils on this day.
